

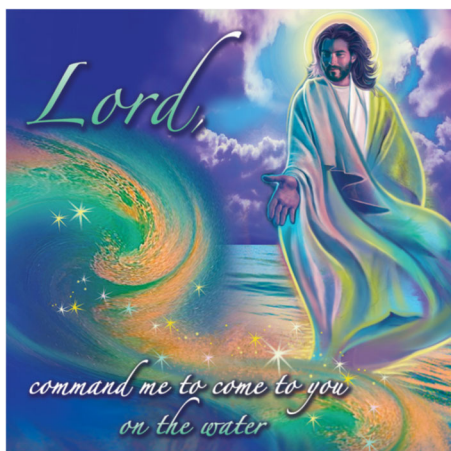

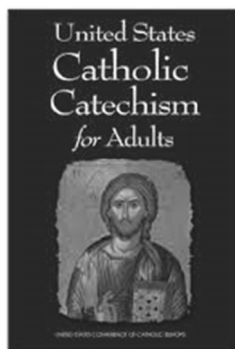

Study Series:

United States Catholic Catechism for Adults

Have you ever wondered how the tenets of our faith are transmitted and shared throughout the world? How do these beliefs get passed down to younger generations? What does the Church believe and teach about topics? It is through the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. *Our Catechism has changed over time; the most recent version was promulgated on October 11, 1992 by Pope John Paul II. Later, the bishops determined that national catechisms - those that take into consideration the local language, culture and customs of each nation's Church - should be written and used as reference and to prepare catechism texts.*

Joint St. Pius & St. Matthias Confirmation Program

Confirmation is the last of three sacraments of initiation that one receives. The sacrament is closely linked to Baptism in that it confirms one's faith and bestows the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Starting in 2017-2018, our Confirmation preparation will be combined with St. Pius parish. Sabrina will coordinate this program with volunteers and staff from both parishes. Fr. Joji Rayanna Pudota will be preaching at St. Matthias next weekend as part of the annual Missionary Co-op collection. Fr. Pudota is from the diocese of Guntur in India which was founded in 1940. There are about 220,000 Catholics in the diocese with a population of 5 million. There are 87 parishes with other 500 mission stations. Catholics of this area belong to a poor class who live in utter poverty unable to eke out a living from their meager daily seasonal agricultural wages.

We look forward to hosting Fr. Pudota and learning more about his mission.

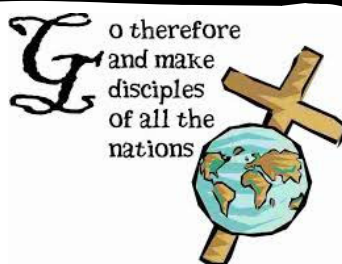

Becoming Catholic – RCIA

Do you know someone who has thought about becoming Catholic or, for whatever reason, has been baptized but has not been confirmed or received Holy Communion?

The Roman Catholic Church has a process for adults who desire to become Catholic or to complete the Sacraments of Initiation for those already Baptized (Confirmation, Eucharist).

This process is called RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). The RCIA process provides weekly sessions on the fundamental beliefs of our faith as well as an understanding of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist (Mass). In addition, the process emphasizes prayer, discernment and spiritual formation as each candidate responds to his or her call to become followers of Jesus through the Catholic Church.

This year RCIA will be held on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:15 a.m. in the rectory. The first RCIA gathering will be held on Sunday, September 17th. Parishioners who would like to participate as an RCIA team member and support our candidates are welcome.

Deacon Rich and Deacon David will lead and facilitate RCIA. If you have any questions, know of someone who would like to discuss joining RCIA, are considering being a team member, or would just like to experience the RCIA process, please contact Deacon Rich before or after Mass or email him at rich@stmatthiasparish.org.

Please pray that the Holy Spirit calls individuals to seek a deeper relationship with Almighty God through His Church.

Altar Servers Needed

All children, after receiving their First Communion, are eligible to become Altar Servers. The Altar Server provides a very important

ministry at each Mass. Servers assist the priest and deacon in the procession to the altar, holding the Roman Missal for prayers, helping to set the table and leading the recession at the conclusion of Mass.

Being a server is also a spiritual and prayerful experience for a young girl or boy. This ministry helps our children grow in their faith. It also involves them in our St. Matthias Community in the practice of our faith through Mass.

Deacon Rich provides training for new servers. A guidebook will also be provided to parents so they can be supportive. New servers will also be paired with experienced servers during the first year of this ministry.

If you would like to schedule a time for training, please contact Deacon Rich. A new schedule begins in October. We need more altar servers to help us ensure that we have Altar Servers at all of our weekend Masses. Adults who are interested in serving at Mass are also invited to serve and should contact Deacon Rich.

Our Pastoral Plan, "Shaping Our Future," is our guide to continuous improvement for St. Matthias Parish Community. Long term goals in each of the areas of parish effectiveness contribute to developing a culture of caring, belonging and service to one another.

While we are known as a *welcoming parish*, our goal is to become a parish within which each parishioner feels a part of our parish community, is engaged in at least one program or ministry, and grows spiritually as a follower and intentional disciple of Jesus Christ.

During this past year, we have experienced a new model of parish leadership. Fathers Paul, Tom and Ted serve our sacramental needs. In addition, they collaborate with our Parish Staff, our Councils and Commissions, to lead and guide us into the future.

Significant accomplishments this past year include: establishment of a Stewardship Commission, updating our database information on current parishioners, increasing our Sunday collections, use of our Building Fund (e.g. resurfacing parking lots), several presentations and activities related to social justice and charitable organizations along with faith formation programs (e.g. retreats, GIFT, Bible Study).

Our Parish Staff, the Pastoral Council and our Commissions have developed an action plan for each of the seven areas in our Pastoral Plan. In upcoming bulletins, I will provide a summary of our 2017-18 plans for Stewardship, Prayer and Worship, Justice and Charity, Community Building, Catechesis, Family and Pastoral Care and Evangelization.

We are looking forward to 2017-18, continuing to shape the future of our St. Matthias Catholic Community.

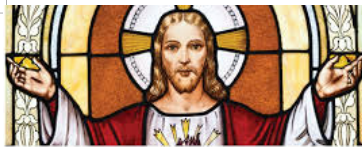
