## Masses of Remembrance

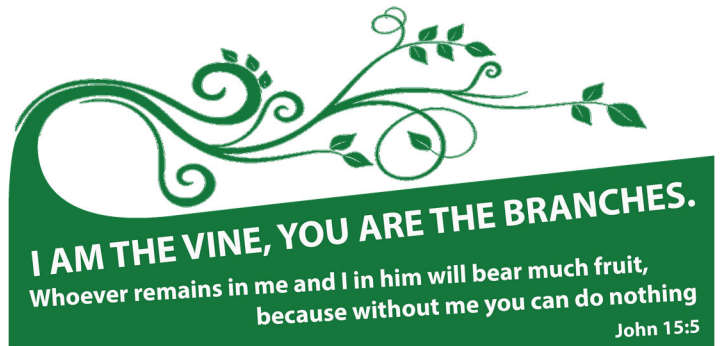

## Processional Cross & Altar Cloth

You may have noticed that the processional cloth was moved back to the hallway between the sanctuary and sacristy. There are two reasons for this change. Firstly, according to liturgical environment guidelines, worship spaces should not include duplicate statues. Our primary image of Jesus is the corpus, hanging above the altar. This processional cross is a duplicate. Secondly, we have purchase banners to enhance our worship space. The banners will be placed on stands on either side of the tabernacle niche.

Also, you might have noticed that we have a new altar cloth. This beautiful cloth was donated by a parishioner in honor of her mother and father. It was purchased specially in New York and was made in Poland. We appreciate this beautiful gift.

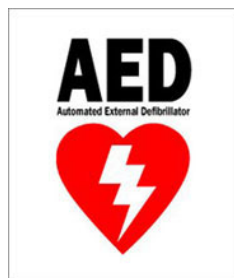

**Caring for Ourselves** We have had an AED, “Automated External Defibrillator”, donated to the parish. It is located in Fr. Lacey Hall, on the wall right where all the large tables are placed. It is to be used for a cardiac emergency of heart attack and it is to be accompanied by an immediate call to 911. Please familiarize yourself with its location. Although we hope to never have to use it, we believe having one available to our community will be a huge health benefit. It has been proven that the immediate use of an AED has significantly improved the outcomes of people suffering from a heart attack.



## Bible Study with Deacon Rich: St. Paul’s Letters



According to theologian Fr. Raymond Brown, “Next to Jesus, Paul has been the most influential figure in the history of Christianity.” Although Paul was not one of the twelve Apostles, he called himself “The Apostle to the Gentiles.” In his letters, St. Paul describes the implications of Jesus’s ministry and his teachings for particular communities of believers.

Deacon Rich will lead a seven week Bible Study series on Paul’s “First Letter to the Thessalonians” and “Letter to the Galatians.” Sessions will be held in Fr.
