Our Call to Catechesis & Evangelization

All Saints Day, November 1, Is a Holy Day of Obligation

All Hallows' Eve is on Tuesday, October 31. Wednesday, November 1, is the Solemnity of All Saints and is a holy day of obligation, with attendance at Mass obligatory for Catholics. St. Matthias will celebrate Mass at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, November 1st. The following day, Thursday, November 2, is the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day). All Souls' Day is not a holy day of obligation. Two more holy days of obligation will occur in 2017: Friday, December 8, the Immaculate Conception of Mary; and Monday, December 25, The Nativity of the Lord.

We will also be honoring all those who have entered into heaven through an "ofrenda" (offering in Spanish) an offering table to the dead. We offer our love and prayers to those who have departed. This will be located in the back of Church and people will be invited to bring photos and other mementos of their loved ones to display during the month of November. You are invited to write a short paragraph of who you'd like to honor and place it with the items you bring to offer.

Masses of Remembrance

On November 4 & 5, we will celebrate Masses of Remembrance, remembering those who have died between November 2016 and October 2017. A family member or friend will light a candle for that person during one of our three weekend Masses. We will also have a Table of the Dead. If you would like to put a picture of your loved one on the table, you can bring it on Nov 4 & 5th. Pictures will be displayed for the entire month. Processional Cross & Altar Cloth

You may have noticed that the processional cloth was moved back to the hallway between the sanctuary and sacristy. There are two reasons for this change. First, according to liturgical environment guidelines, worship spaces should not include duplicate statues. Our primary image of Jesus is the corpus, hanging above the altar. This processional cross is a duplicate. Second, we have purchased banners to enhance our worship space. The banners will be placed on stands on either side of the tabernacle niche.

Also, you might have noticed that we have a new altar cloth. This beautiful cloth was donated by a parishioner, Fran Giannattasio, in honor of her mother and father. It was purchased specially in New York and was made in Poland. We appreciate this beautiful gift.



Liturgical Environment Committee

Have you ever wondered who cleans the Church, washes the linens, provides flowers or makes sure the plants are watered? Who decorates the Church for special liturgical seasons like Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter? We have a group formerly called the Altar Society, but now called the Liturgical Environment Committee that does all of these "behind the scenes" jobs to make sure the Church atmosphere is conducive to worship and enhances the experience of parishioners and visitors.
