

First Reading — There is no other name under heaven by which we are to be saved than the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene (Acts 4:8-12).

JESUS HAS RISEN
THIS CHANGES EVERYTHING

At the Easter Vigil, the St. Matthias Community welcomed our new members as they received the Sacraments of Initiation. We extend our warmest welcome to Katie Sakai, North West, Kayla Aleem, Sydney Aleem and John Lessar. With smiles on their faces and some tears, they received hugs from sponsors and family members and applause from the congregation.

Easter is a time of celebration of the Lord's resurrection, culminating in his Ascension to the Father and the sending of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. There are 50 days of Easter from the first Sunday to Pentecost. We sing "Alleluia!" St. Paul writes, "If Christ has not been raised, then empty is our preaching then empty too, your faith." (1 Cor 15: 14) All faith flows from our faith in the resurrection.

The word "Easter" comes from Old English, meaning simply the "East." As we all know, the sun rises in the east. The morning light brings warmth and hope. Light is the symbol of Christ, the Light of the World. The Paschal (Easter) Candle is our symbol of divine light. Our Paschal Candle is lit at every Mass during Easter time. It is also lit at all Baptisms and Funerals throughout the year.

During Easter Time, we will be saying the Apostles Creed rather than the Nicene Creed. The Apostles Creed was written in the second century. It reflects a summary of what was being taught by the Apostles and their disciples in the early Church. It expresses our core beliefs which are fundamental to our faith.

One statement may catch your attention, "He descended into hell." What does that mean? The Catechism tells us, (CCC 633) *Hell . . . those who are deprived of the vision of God . . . whether evil or righteous, while they await the redeemer. Jesus did die and he conquered death through His resurrection. He opened Heaven's gates for the righteous.*

Throughout the Easter season, we will continue to recall our Baptismal promises, be blessed with holy water from our Baptismal font and gather as the St. Matthias Catholic Community to celebrate and give thanks to God for His love, His kindness and His mercy.

Justice & Charity Survey

In 2015, our parish adopted a new Pastoral Plan, entitled *Shaping Our Future*. The plan was designed to provide a long-range focus for our community as we continue on our journey of faith that compels us to seek new and better ways to bear witness to the Gospel message of love, compassion, and mercy. The plan focuses on several areas of witness including our call to justice and charity and calls for identifying special charitable and social justice areas that can be supported by the parish as a whole. To this end, we will be asking you, next weekend, during each Mass, to complete short survey that will help us to identify which charity-based and social justice interests you think we, as a parish should consider. We last conducted a similar survey in April 2016, two years ago. During these last two years, our priority has been homelessness, hunger, affordable housing, and poverty. Those issues will certainly remain part of our work, however, we also acknowledge that our nation, our city and our parish community have undergone major changes in this time. For that reason, we feel that a new survey is timely and will help guide our efforts in the year to come.

The survey will also be emailed to parishioners using our email blast system on April 30th. Up until a few years ago, St. Matthias had a "Preschool Sunday" program, led by a group of parents, during the 10:30 am Mass on Sunday mornings. GIFT: Generations in Faith Together

For families, but not limited to just families, GIFT gatherings are our intergenerational approach to Faith Formation. Gatherings are held two times each month, on a Sunday afternoon, then repeated on Wednesday evening. At each gathering, there is a meal, opening prayer and introduction of the topic. Families participate in the activities and discussion, sometimes in a large group setting, sometimes in break-out groups by family or age range. Topics are presented in such a way as to coach parents in the practice of catechizing their own children. GIFT is intended to complement liturgical events and other parish activities.

All families who have school aged children are invited to attend these gatherings and encouraged to participate each year.

Our last gatherings for the 2017-2018 year will be on Sunday, April 29th from 11:30-1:30 pm and repeated on Wednesday, May 2nd from 6:00-8:00 pm. We take a break during the summer months, and begin registering for the upcoming year in August. If you have not attended previously, you are welcome at attend these last gatherings!
