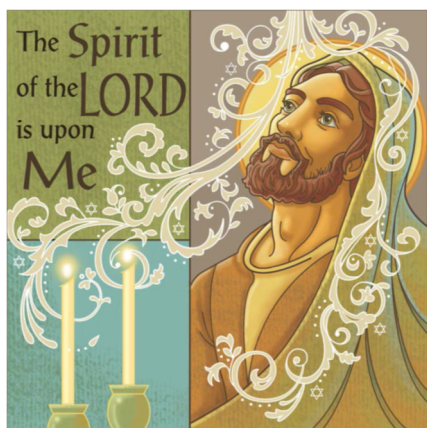

Fr. Tom's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today's second reading from Saint Paul to the Corinthians continues a theme we reflected upon last week in which Saint Paul spoke of the multiplicity of gifts we receive through God's grace. Saint Paul offers the image of the various parts of the body to demonstrate our interdependence and mutual support of one another as baptized companions of Jesus. The late Reverend Martin Luther King, Jr., whose birthday we as a nation celebrated last week, wrote in a speech in 1967 that: "It really boils down to this: that all life is interrelated. We are all caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied to a single garment of destiny. Whatever affects one directly, affects all indirectly. We are made to live together because of the interrelated structure of reality."

These salient words of Reverend King reflect what Saint Paul is telling us. We cannot be indifferent to one another as members of the Body of Christ. We are not mutually exclusive and utterly reliant upon ourselves. There is the temptation at times to become isolated in our reality, to become disengaged from the experiences of those around us. As we meditate upon the Eucharist and how, by its very essence it unifies us as One Body, we begin to see that our interconnectedness is foundational to our Christian identity. As Saint Paul wrote, "God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share in its joy."

Saint Luke, of the four evangelists, begins his Gospel with a preface. He addresses it to Theophilus, which in Greek means "friend of God." Luke frames the body of the Gospel with a beautiful backdrop of describing how Jesus returned to Galilee and then journeyed on to Nazareth, preached to the people and transformed their lives. In the temple he reveals that as the Messiah he is the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free."

Through the gift and grace of Baptism, in the spirit of mutual interdependence of which Saint Paul speaks, the Lord invites each of us to be heralds of the Good News, glad tidings, in the varied circumstances of our lives. We can do this in a number of ways: speaking words of encouragement to others; listening with compassion and empathy to someone who is experiencing struggle and difficulty in life; exercising works of mercy such as supporting the Saint Vincent de Paul Society or donating to local agencies which provide services to the poor, the elderly, the homeless. Let us ask the Lord to help us to be open and free to living out the Gospel imperative to love one another by fulfilling and making concrete the words of the prophet Isaiah we have heard proclaimed this day!

Farewell to Sr. Dee Myers, BVM

Sr. Dee Myers, BVM will be permanently moving to Dubuque, Iowa on Feb. 3rd. Having spent 30 years in California ministering at

various places including 17 years at St. Matthias, she will be closer to family. Her move is precipitated at this time, (who would ever move to sub-zero weather in the middle of winter???) because her sister is suffering a setback and needs extra family care. Esther recently entered a rehab center after her third fall. She is 95 and has been living independently up until Dec. 31.

She will live at their Motherhouse which is where she began her life as a Sister of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (BVM) 62 years ago with 100 other young women. Now, there are less than twenty in her group; some have left BVM life through the years; others are deceased. She is looking forward to a quieter time of service to those in need, (mainly her sister right now), classes, activities and prayerful times with other members, outings and play time along the Mississippi River. The Convent is located on a high bluff, viewing one of the wider parts of the Mississippi with bridges connecting to Illinois and Wisconsin. The city of Dubuque is on water level and boasts of many activities (when the ice melts) including the River Boat that sails from Minnesota down to New Orleans. It is not California, but it has its own kind of beauty. God diversifies in creation!

"I have heard that St. Matthias is having your usual Hospitality Sunday on January 27th, so I will join you for Mass at 10:30 and then share donuts and coffee as I say farewell to so many wonderful peo-

ple of my past. It was always a pleasure ministering at St. Matthias with you and I carry such rich memories of being with you as your children grew from babes to the now young adults who are finishing college and leading in our world. The spiritual grounding they received from your example and beliefs as well as the enriching from faith formation and practices within the St. Matthias Community has been embedded in their souls. They will know where to turn when they need it. They will be familiar with the ultimate technological app."

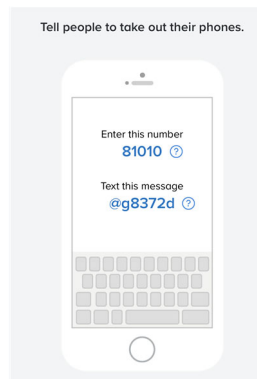
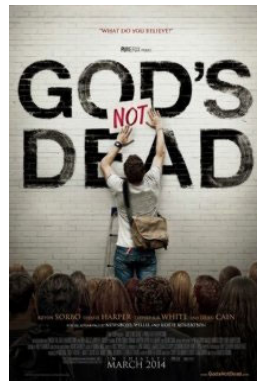
High School Youth Ministry
