



Lenten Regulations

The following regulations are in place for Abstaining and Fasting in the Archdiocese of San Francisco:

Abstinence: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY, the FRIDAYS of Lent, and GOOD FRIDAY.

Fast: Everyone eighteen years of age and older but under the age of sixty is also bound to fast on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY. On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

Note on St. Patrick's Day, Friday, March 17: The Feast of St. Patrick is a Solemnity within the Archdiocese of San Francisco (since Patrick is the Principal Co-Patron of the Archdiocese). March 17, 2017, is a Friday. While normally Lenten observance requires abstinence from meat on the Fridays of Lent, canon law includes the exception: "unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday" (Canon 1251); therefore, within the bounds of the Archdiocese of San Francisco, the faithful are not required to abstain from meat on March 17, 2017.

Stations of the Cross and Soup Suppers for Lent

During Lent, we will have Stations of the Cross every Friday, at 6:00 pm starting March 3rd through April 7th. A Soup Supper in the Hall will follow the Stations. A different Station will be said each week including The Stations of the Cross with John Paul II: On the path of ecological conversion; The Stations of the Cross for the Poor; Mary's Way of the Cross and Walk with Me the Way of the Cross. St. Matthias parish has a commitment to helping its parishioners deepen their spirituality. As part of our pastoral plan, Shaping the Future, one of the stated objectives is to “develop a resource for those who are seeking Spiritual Direction.”

Spiritual Direction at its best entirely focuses on helping the directee to become attentive to the presence, action, and movements of God in ordinary human experiences, and on noticing the directee’s own responses to these movements of the Holy. These sessions are usually an hour long and take place once a month at the St. Matthias rectory. A parishioner, Tim Valderrama, is


Action plans are developed and reviewed each year to define strategies, programs and services to guide the parish leadership and the parish as a whole toward these goals and our overall mission.

Characters such as Christ, Pilate, Peter and priests are active. We use a large crowd in much of the play. They yell a lot. A narrator has a big part. We have used girls and boys in many of the roles. We need two big Guards who have moderate, non-speaking roles.

Youth from any church are welcome to participate. Please bring in your friends. Even ones who have not attended our church, but have an interest. From experience, we can proudly state that our cast members will feel very proud and happy that they were involved.
