

Psalm — My God, my God, why have you abandoned me? (Psalm 22)

Second Reading — Christ emptied himself, and God filled this emptiness with exaltation (Philippians 2:6-11).

Bible Study with Deacon Rich: Acts of the Apostles

Have you wondered what happened after Jesus ascended into Heaven? How did the early Church not only survive, but grow? What role did Peter and Paul play in the foundation and formation of the Body of Christ, His Church? The book of the “Acts of the Apostles” provides answers to these and other questions.

Acts is a story of hope. It is a story of how a few Christians empowered by the Holy Spirit were chosen to bring Christ and the Good News to the ends of the earth. Weekly readings, presentations and discussions, along with some video clips, will enrich your faith and rekindle your love for Christ as you relive the lives of his first disciples during this Easter time.

Beginning **Monday, April 24th**, Deacon Rich will lead an eight-week Bible Study series on “Acts of the Apostles.” Sessions will be held in Fr. Lacey Hall from 7 – 8:30 p.m. each Monday from April 24th through June 19th (no session on Memorial Day). Please bring your Bible, notepad and pen. While any Catholic Bible will work, the preferred Bibles are the New Revised Standard Version and The New American Bible. Please join us for any or all of the sessions. Lenten Regulations

The following regulations are in place for Abstaining and Fasting in the Archdiocese of San Francisco:

Abstinence: Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY, the FRIDAYS of Lent, and GOOD FRIDAY.

Fast: Everyone eighteen years of age and older but under the age of sixty is also bound to fast on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY. On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.

Building Fund Collection—April 8/9

Our parish Rectory and preschool recently had some plumbing issues. Both buildings have aging infrastructure. The preschool building was built in the 1960's and we estimate the Rectory to have been built in the 1930's; both have original plumbing. We work closely with a plumber to try to mitigate the issues and stay on top of them, but clogged sewer drains are expensive and taxing to our building fund.



Although functioning properly at the moment, both buildings need additional plumbing attention. The Preschool building needs an extra clean out installed and the Rectory needs 10' of pipe dug up and replaced to remedy the current problems.

This weekend is our Building Fund collection. Although we have some funds on reserve, these repairs will be costly and the reserve was being held for the parking lot resealing/restriping. Please consider a generous donation to help with these needed repairs.

Triduum

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum—from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are:

Mass of the Lord's Supper (Holy Thursday) - April 13th @ 6:00 pm A special part of our Holy Week celebration is the Seder Supper that we will celebrate this year on April 13th. The Seder Supper will begin at 6:00 pm followed by Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:15 pm. Join us and celebrate this very special meal and liturgy where we honor our Jewish roots, the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. Sign-up sheets are available in the Hall. If anyone would like to help prepare the food or help with setup for the Seder Supper, please contact Liz Vugrinecz at 366-9544 x. 12 or liz@stmatthiasparish.org.

At the Mass of the Lord's Supper there will be the washing of the feet of "12 disciples" after which the community will be invited to come up and have their feet washed by one of those 12 people. In turn, those who had their feet washed are invited to serve others by washing the foot of those who follow. It is a very profound and humbling experience as we recreate this act of service instituted by Jesus at the Last Supper.

The final act of the liturgy is the procession to the Altar of repose. Fr. Tom (our celebrant for the Triduum) will lead this procession into the Hall and Merry Room where adoration will take place. The Merry Room will be open for prayer and adoration until 9:30 pm.

Good Friday of the Lord's Passion (Good Friday Liturgy) - April 14th @ 12:00 noon Our Good Friday services will begin with Solemn Prayer at 12:00 pm, Stations of the Cross at 12:30 pm, the Solemn Liturgy at 1:30 pm and will end with our youth Passion Play at 7:00 pm.

Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord (Easter Vigil) - April 15th @ 8:00 pm At this liturgy we hear the story of our Salvation history. New fire and water are blessed and, all over the world, new Catholics are welcomed into the Church through reception of the sacraments of initiation.

Easter Sunday

Easter Sunday Masses—April 16th @ 8:00 am and 10:30 am Our annual Easter Egg Hunt will take place in the Hall following the 10:30 am Mass. All children are invited to participate.




Our Call to Community Building

Our Call to Stewardship is one of the key components of our Pastoral Plan, Shaping Our Future. Our plan states that, "To be Christian stewards of all God's gifts to us includes more than a generous giving of time, talent and treasure."

Pope Francis writes that, "Any Church community, if it thinks it can comfortably go its own way without creative concern and effective cooperation in helping the poor to live with dignity and reaching out to everyone, will also risk breaking down, however much it may talk about social issues or criticize governments. It will easily drift into spiritual worldliness, camouflaged by religious practices, unproductive meetings and empty talk."



Our newly formed Stewardship Commission is developing an action plan for 2017-18 beginning with our Verification Sundays which enable us to update our parish database. In the near future, the Commission will be surveying parishioners about their talents and ways to become or continue to be an active steward in our parish community. Our April GIFT session will focus on the spiritual aspects of stewardship and is open to all parishioners.

As we approach the great celebration of Easter, we are reminded of the importance of our Baptismal promises. The practice of renewing Baptismal promises at Easter is essential of all of us who are stewards of our faith. Stewardship is our response to Jesus invitation to "follow him." We follow Jesus by proclaiming the Gospel in word and deed, helping to build up our parish community and sharing the peace of Christ with one another.
