



Bible Study with Deacon Rich: St. Paul's Letters

According to theologian Fr. Raymond Brown, "Next to Jesus, Paul has been the most influential figure in the history of Christianity." Although Paul was not one of the twelve Apostles, he called himself "The Apostle to the Gentiles." In his letters, St. Paul describes the implications of Jesus's ministry and his teachings for particular communities of believers.

Since Paul's letters are a part of the New Testament and proclaimed at most Masses, no Christian has been unaffected by what he has written. Paul's letters provide further context and insights into the developments within the early Church as described in Acts of the Apostles. What can we learn from Paul's writings that will help each one of us to deepen our belief in a loving God and guide us to more fully live our Catholic Christian faith?

Beginning **Monday, September 11th**, Deacon Rich will lead a seven week Bible Study series on Paul's "First Letter to the Thessalonians" and "Letter to the Galatians." Sessions will be held in Fr. Lacy Hall from 7 – 8:30 p.m. each Monday from September 11th through October 23rd. Please bring your Bible, notepad and pen. While any Catholic Bible will work, the preferred Bibles are the New Revised Standard Version and The New American Bible. Please join us for any or all of the sessions. Joint St. Pius & St. Matthias Confirmation Program

Confirmation is the last of three sacraments of initiation that one receives. The sacrament is closely linked to Baptism in that it confirms one's faith and bestows the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Starting in 2017-2018, our Confirmation preparation will be combined with St. Pius parish. Sabrina will coordinate this program with volunteers and staff from both parishes. Becoming Catholic – RCIA

Do you know someone who has thought about becoming Catholic or, for whatever reason, has been baptized but has not been confirmed or received Holy Communion?

The Roman Catholic Church has a process for adults who desire to become Catholic or to complete the Sacraments of Initiation for those already Baptized (Confirmation, Eucharist).

This process is called RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). The RCIA process provides weekly sessions on the fundamental beliefs of our faith as well as an understanding of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist (Mass). In addition, the process emphasizes prayer, discernment and spiritual formation as each candidate responds to his or her call to become followers of Jesus through the Catholic Church.

This year RCIA will be held on Sunday mornings from 9:15-10:15 a.m. in the rectory. The first RCIA gathering will be held on Sunday, September 17th. Parishioners who would like to participate as an RCIA team member and support our candidates are welcome.

Deacon Rich and Deacon David will lead and facilitate RCIA. If you have any questions, know of someone who would like to discuss joining RCIA, are considering being a team member, or would just like to experience the RCIA process, please contact Deacon Rich before or after Mass or email him at rich@stmatthiasparish.org.

Please pray that the Holy Spirit calls individuals to seek a deeper relationship with Almighty God through His Church.

Altar Servers Needed

All children, after receiving their First Communion, are eligible to become Altar Servers. The Altar Server provides a very important



ministry at each Mass. Servers assist the priest and deacon in the procession to the altar, holding the Roman Missal for prayers, helping to set the table and leading the recessional at the conclusion of Mass.

Being a server is also a spiritual and prayerful experience for a young girl or boy. This ministry helps our children grow in their faith. It also involves them in our St. Matthias Community in the practice of our faith through Mass.

Deacon Rich provides training for new servers. A guidebook will also be provided to parents so they can be supportive. New servers will be paired with experienced servers during the first year of this ministry.

If you would like to schedule a time for training, please contact Deacon Rich. A new schedule begins in October. We need more altar servers to help us ensure that we have Altar Servers at all of our weekend Masses. Adults who are interested in serving at Mass are also invited to serve and should contact Deacon Rich.

Our Call to Community Building

Shaping Our Future ~ Justice & Charity for 2017-18

Our Pastoral Plan, *Shaping Our Future*, is our guide to continuous improvement for the St. Matthias Parish Community. Long term goals in each of the areas of parish effectiveness contribute to developing a culture of caring, belonging and service to one another. One of the areas of parish life is Justice and Charity.

As a part of our new model of leadership, we have established councils and commissions. The Justice and Charity Commission (JCC) provides leadership and coordination in this area of our parish plan. JCC members include: Evie Dwyer, Mariano Degang, Nancy Galli, Bob Thompson, Deacon David Rolandelli, Liz Vugrinecz, Sabrina Harper, Deacon George Salinger and Deacon Rich Foley.

As a result of a parish survey in the spring of 2016, parishioners identified four priorities: poverty, hunger, affordable housing and homelessness. During 2016-2017, the Justice and Charity Commission (JCC) presented a series of presentations and panel discussions on these topics. Representatives from local social justice and charitable agencies (e.g. St. Vincent de Paul) shared information and stories about the good work going on in our community. They also shared about the continuing need for donations, and, more importantly, volunteers.

During the 2017-2018 year, our JSS has planned a number of service opportunities to actively engage parishioners. Our year began with the annual clothing drive for St. Francis Center. The response from so many parishioners has an impact on the lives of many being served at St. Francis Center. Our thanks to Laura and Anna Granucci for coordinating this initiative.

In the next few weeks the JCC will publish a calendar or menu of opportunities. These opportunities include family as well as individual activities. The list also includes some St. Matthias traditions (e.g. The Giving Tree, Preschool Toy Drive and the annual Maple Street Shelter Dinner).
