Pilgrimage to Ecuador (Mission Trip)

Every other year, since 2010, Sabrina Harper and Maria Cornell have been leading a group of youth from St. Pius and St. Matthias parishes on a pilgrimage to Ecuador.

The group visits and works at Damien House, a home for patients with Hansen's disease in Guayaquil, Ecuador. There, they accompany Sr. Annie Credidio, BVM as she ministers to the elderly who are afflicted with this debilitating disease.

Also part of the trip is time spent at the Working Boys' Center: A Family of Families in Quito, Ecuador. Founded over 60 years ago by Jesuit priest Fr. John Halligan, SJ and operated by Sr. Cindy Sullivan and Sr. Miguel, members of the Sisters of Charity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Center provides educational and vocational training for the poorest of the poor in and around Quito.

We are beginning to recruit for next summer's trip!

It will be at the end of June for about 2 weeks. If your son/daughter is interested (they must have completed their freshman year of high school at the time of the trip) plan to attend the Information Meeting which will be held on **Monday, November 27th at 7:00 pm in Fr. TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we have a modern feast, less than a century old, and placed at the very end of the liturgical cycle of Sundays only in 1969. In 1925, the world was in a sorry state from the vantage point of Pope Pius XI. The winds of war had swept the map of Europe raw, and ancient Christian dynasties had fallen in Russia and Spain. Although the Great War had ended, wars were breaking out everywhere. Fascism was already in control in Italy, and Nazism was on the horizon for Germany. The disorder making its claim on the human race was, the pope felt, an insult to the Divine Order. Pius XI designated the last Sunday in October as a day of universal recognition of the kingship of Christ. Creating this feast was an act of bravery by the pope, who was standing up against idolatry of the state and the dehumanizing forces of the modern world, things that are not hard to detect in today's world as well. In 1969 it seemed fitting to move the feast to a place of honor at the end of the year, a way of summing up the whole movement of the liturgical year toward the perfection of the Kingdom of God. In recent decades, many Protestant churches have adopted this day from the new Roman calendar, so it is shared now with the Church of England, the Episcopal, Presbyterian, and Lutheran churches, and others.

Immaculate Conception

The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is on Friday, December 8th. This is a Holy Day of Obligation. **St. Matthias will be celebrated with a Vigil Mass on Thursday, December 7th at 7:00 pm.** All are invited to honor the Holy Mother with us that day.

Blessing of the Table of the Dead

Lighting of a votive candle is one way to express our remembrance of those who have died. Another way is with our Dio de los Muertos or Table of the Dead. This is a tradition handed down by indigenous people of Mexico who believed that death is a part of the cycle of life. Symbols reflect the elements of wind, water, fire and earth. Flowers, incense, candles and a crucifix or cross are meant to attract souls to our remembrance celebration. The table honors those who have died—our relatives and friends. Pictures and artifacts of the deceased are displayed. Our memories are stirred. Our prayers are invited to be offered throughout the month of November.

Thank you to all who put pictures of their loved ones on the Table of the Dead. It was a beautiful display. If you put pictures up, please pick them up the weekend

of November 25 or 26 which is the last weekend when the Table of the Dead will be up.

Simbang Gabi Advent Novena of Masses

Simbang Gabi is being hosted in six parishes this year as listed in the following schedule. The novena of Masses begins on December 15 and culminates on December 23. Those who will be going from church to church to complete the nine-day celebration of Masses are encouraged to return to their home parish for Christmas Masses.
