

Merry Christmas and Blessings to all our parishioners and visitors of St. Pius St. Matthias Churches:

I pray that this Christmas Season, which extends to the Baptism of the Lord, Jan. 8, is filled with many blessings to all of you in the form of peace, joy and hope, especially in these challenging times. May the peace of God, who is Jesus, be with you and your loved ones now and throughout the New Year of 2018.

I am grateful to all of you who have prayed for my healing throughout these past several months of challenges to my health and for the cards and notes you have sent me; know how very grateful and appreciative I am to you all. For you to know--After experiencing severe fatigue over the past several months, since the ending of summer, as well as suffering from the atrial fibrillation I have had for over 10 years and experiencing sleep apnea for several years, I suffered a stroke while celebrating a daily 8:00 AM Mass on Wed. Sept. 27. After spending 4 days at Sequoia Hospital, I returned to the rectory and began recuperating while working with my cardiologist to see the best way to handle my stroke, most likely caused from the atrial-fibrillation. After taking some speech therapy to counteract some of the effects of the stroke and having started the blood thinner, Eliquis, I took steps to protect myself from further strokes and to deal with both my heart and sleeping disorders. Thus, Monday, Dec. 4, I went to Sequoia Hospital where I had an atrial ablation to address my atrial-fibrillation and recently, through Sequoia Hospital Sleep Center, have begun improving my sleep by addressing the sleep apnea with a breathing device. I have been recuperating for the past couple weeks, post ablation, trying to regain my energy and stamina. I am slowly feeling better, while not returning to a type of hectic schedule I am used to following.

After the New Year I am hoping to get back into a more regular routine here and at St. Matthias. I simply need to care for my health by not returning to unhealthy life and work patterns, as in ignoring the need for proper and sufficient sleep, rest and relaxation and being caught up with anxiety and stress. Again, I thank all of you for your concern and understanding as seen in your prayerful support of me over these past months; I am very grateful to you all!

As you may know, Fr. Tom Martin will be returning to us Jan. 1, as he is completing his temporary role as administrator of St. Veronica's. With the Archbishop's suggestion and appointment, I am grateful that Fr. Tom will be helping me as Pastor by acting as temporary administrator of St. Pius and St. Matthias. His skilled presence will be welcomed by me and our staff as we go forth into 2018, always with the intent of how best we can serve our communities.

I also want to thank Fr. Nic Paloso for serving our two parishes while Fr. Tom was away and wish Fr. Nic many blessings as he heads toward his ministry with St. Timothy's, San Mateo. God bless you, Fr. Nic.

Gratitude as well to all who have brought clergy and staff many food gifts and other items, for which we all are most grateful. Thanks greatly to Brian Tupper and our Men's Club for the wonderful service again working the Tree Lot---good support to our parish--Thank you.

Our Call to Justice & Charity: The Two Feet of Love in Action

Recently, our Justice and Charity Commission had the privilege to learn about a local service being provided by VOCA. VOCA is a new platform connecting people with their local government via text message. Its mission is to strengthen democracy by simplifying and expanding civic participation. VOCA works in the following way: users receive one text message question a week about a local issue in their town or city. They reply with a numeric level of support (1 to 5 just like a Yelp or Amazon review), along with an optional comment. Answers are then collected and shared by VOCA with city council, any relevant city commission or staff, on social media, and of course with VOCA users. Lastly, VOCA is laser-focused on simplicity and accessibility: there's nothing

to download, no user-name and password to remember, and it is available in both English and Spanish. Also, all VOCA answers are completely anonymous.

Right now VOCA is just in Redwood City, and we have over 300 people signed up. The response is generally very positive: elected officials are intrigued, city staff is enthusiastic, and user engagement is strong with many saying they've never felt so connected with what's going on in their city.



Christmas Mass Obligations Clarified: Two Masses are Required

With Christmas Day on a Monday this year, many people want their Mass obligations clarified. The short answer is: Yes, there is a Sunday obligation and a separate Holy Day obligation. The following information has been supplied to all priests of the Archdiocese: The Bridge | December 18, 2017 On Sunday, December 24, which is the Fourth Sunday of Advent, Masses after 4:00 pm should be the Vigil Mass for the Nativity of the Lord and not the Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent. If your parish has a regularly scheduled Sunday evening Mass, the Vigil Mass for the Nativity is to be used. Obligation to Attend Mass: This year we have the unusual occurrence of the obligation to attend Mass on two consecutive days. People ask: 'Can I satisfy two obligations with one Mass?' The U.S. Catholic Bishops have clarified that "When consecutive obligations occur on Saturday-Sunday or Sunday-Monday, the faithful must attend Mass twice to fulfill two separate obligations." Therefore, the people are obliged to attend one Mass for the Fourth Sunday of Advent (from Saturday evening 12/23 up to 4:00 pm on Sunday 12/24); and one Mass for the celebration of the Nativity of the Lord (from 4:00 pm on Sunday 12/24 through all Masses on Monday 12/25).
