May 12-13, 2018


First Reading — Jesus tells the disciples that they will be witnesses to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:1-11).

-Psalm 118:24

Rejoice and Be Glad, Chapter 2

Pope Francis' most recent Apostolic Exhortation is entitled, "*Rejoice and Be Glad.*" He discusses what it means to be holy. We are all called to holiness. The Pope stresses the importance of both prayer and action in discernment toward holiness that goes beyond merely following rules.

In the first chapter, Pope Francis discusses how saints serve as witnesses of our faith. In the second chapter, the Pope writes about the subtle enemies of holiness. From the early days of the Church, heresies emerged in efforts to take away the focus on Jesus as our Savior and Teacher.

One major heresy proclaimed the idea that knowledge is the path to salvation. It is the intellect that leads one to God. Of course, this ideology dismisses the importance of the Spirit working in and through each of us. Church writers have pointed out that while knowledge of doctrine and beliefs are important, they only serve to guide us to lives of compassion, mercy and sharing God's love with one another.

Pope Francis tells us that humility is a key attribute of service to others in God's name. He writes, "A lack of heartfelt and prayerful acknowledgement of our limitations prevents grace from working more effectively within us, for no room is left for bringing about the potential good that is part of a sincere and genuine journey of growth."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that the gift of grace "surpasses the power of human intellect and will." The saints put trust in God. The Church is entrusted to our Popes and Bishops who are guided by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit also works through each one of us. Look for God's grace at work in you and in those you encounter each day. Rejoice and Be Glad!

Our Call to Justice & Charity: The Two Feet of Love *in Action*

Justice & Charity Survey

Thank you for completing the survey last week during Mass or at home, online. We are working on tabulating the results which will be reviewed at our next meeting scheduled for May 17th. We will report back to you the survey results following that meeting.

In 2015, our parish adopted a new Pastoral Plan, entitled *Shaping Our Future*. The plan was designed to provide a long-range focus for our community as we continue on our journey of faith that compels us to seek new and better ways to bear witness to the Gospel message of love, compassion, and mercy. The plan focuses on several areas of witness including our call to justice and charity and calls for identifying special charitable and social justice areas that can be supported by the parish as a whole.

We conducted a similar survey in April 2016, two years ago. During these last two years, our priority has been homelessness, hunger, affordable housing, and poverty. Those issues will certainly remain part of our work; however, we also acknowledge that our nation, our city and our parish community have undergone major changes in this time. For that reason, we feel that a new survey is timely and will help guide our efforts in the year to come.

The survey was emailed to parishioners using our email blast system on April 30th.
