



Father Tom's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The eminent writer David Brooks, the New York Times columnist and author of *The Road of Character*, wrote: "Recently I've been thinking about the difference between the *resume* virtues and the eulogy virtues. The resume virtues are the ones you list on your *resume*, the skills that you bring to the job market and that contribute to external success. The eulogy virtues are deeper. They're the ones that get talked about at your funeral, the ones that exit at the core of your being—whether you are kind, brave, honest or faithful; what kind of relationships you formed." These words are particularly relevant as over the past two weeks we have come together as a community to grieve, support and love the family of Blake Bottarini. Blake, a senior at Junipero Serra High School, parishioner here at St. Matthias, son of Ross and Julie and twin brother of Evan, was tragically killed in a car accident on his way to school. It has been truly extraordinary to see how many people came together to show what it means to love and serve others. I am so proud and grateful to our parish staff as well as those of St. Pius whose generosity and care went a long way in helping to honor Blake and his family as we celebrated his Funeral Mass at St. Pius on September 6th.

I have the privilege of knowing many Serra families through my various ministries on the Peninsula. One of Blake's classmates spoke with me after the funeral. He said, "Father Tom, anybody but Blake. You don't understand. He was just so good, so kind, so giving...anybody but him." The emotional and spiritual pain showed so vividly in this young man's eyes. That image was expressed exponentially in the faces of the Serra students who came together to honor Blake. Yes, this is the natural fear and shock that conjures up doubt and anxiety...perhaps things are not so permanent after all. On a deeper level however, they came to honor the man who possessed the qualities about which David Brooks speaks: Kindness, bravery, honesty, faithfulness, the depth and quality of relationships.

Mark's Gospel today has Jesus posing this question to his disciples: "Who do people say that I am?" They respond, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." He then asks them, "But who do YOU say that I am?" This is a central question that defines who Jesus is to his disciples. He is introducing them to the reality that as the Son of God he will have to suffer, indeed lose his very self, in order to fulfill His Father's mission for him. Naturally, Peter and the others want Jesus to be the Christ without paying the cost. Jesus himself rebukes the disciples because not surrendering HIS WILL is contrary to the relationship between Jesus and His Father. Ironically, it is that very surrender that gives hope and encouragement. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it." When we follow Jesus Christ, when we let go of our own egoism and self-preservation for service in the Kingdom, then we reflect in our lives what it means to be Christ-like.


