

Fr. Tom's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

The message of Baruch in today's first reading rouses the human condition from sorrow and rejection to hope and faith. It propels us to a hopeful future, the very essence of what this time of preparation before the Incarnation is about. Baruch's message is uplifting as it points to hope in the providential love of God. It offers a symmetry and alignment with God's desire for the human family. This parallels a central tenet of Advent, that "God is leading Israel in joy by the light of his glory, with his mercy and justice for company." Baruch speaks with great credibility of one who has suffered greatly but still points to hopeful expectation. He was regarded as a close friend and "secretary" to the prophet Jeremiah. He witnessed catastrophic sorrow for the people of Israel, including the turbulent end of the kingdom of Judah, the Babylonian destruction of Jerusalem and exile in Egypt. Imagine having such faith after witnessing all of this hardship!

The maxim of evolving and becoming, annunciated in Baruch's summons to the people of Israel to shed their old ways for new, finds confirmation in Paul's Letter to the Philippians. "I am confident of this, that the one who has begun a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus." The completion of God's work comes after the history of salvation is played out, beginning with Adam and Eve, marching through the history of the Jewish people, manifested in the challenges and excitement of the early Christian communities, down to our very own day and generation and culminating in the End Times. In every generation, God speaks to us through prophetic voices calling us to reconciliation and a conversion of heart. From Isaiah to Jeremiah to John the Baptist, the Lord continually invites us to push on and move forward to our being ultimately united forever and all time with the God of history.

The theme of hope expressed by Baruch and Saint Paul continues in the prophetic call of John the Baptist in Luke's gospel. It is an awesome reflection to see how God speaks to us through the most unlikely circumstances. Remember that John the Baptist was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth. They had tried for many years to bear a child, and Zechariah, a priest of the Temple, went time and again to pray for this gift. It was realized in old age in the person of John the Baptist, who is called to be the herald of the good news that the Messiah is coming into the world. That is the mastery as well as the mystery of how God's grace works! It is important to recognize the context into which John's prophetic call is heard. The Jewish people were living under Roman political and military occupation; they were held captive in their own home. This was a dangerous time and place; and yet, it is within this dynamic that God chooses to bring His Son into the world.

This reality makes all the more remarkable God's love for us and His continual desire to draw us to Himself in the midst of life's sometimes challenging and difficult circumstances. The word of God, spoken through the voice of John, beckons the human family to repentance and the forgiveness of sins. May we continue in this season of light and hope to encourage ourselves and one another to a spirit and realization of a conversion of heart and mutual forgiveness!



In addition, our youth candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation were presented to the community by their sponsors. Confirmation is the third and last Sacrament of Initiation for those Baptized as infants. This sacrament involves a laying on of hands and anointing with oil by the Bishop and imparts the Gifts of the Holy Spirit: Wisdom, Understanding, Knowledge, Right Judgement, Courage, Reverence, and Wonder and Awe.

Sabrina coordinates the preparation process and the annual retreat. During the preparation process, young people and their sponsors reflect on these gifts of the Holy Spirit and how they can be more fully aware of, and present to, the gift of faith that God has freely given them.
