Lenten Stations of the Cross & Soup Suppers

Fridays at 6:00 pm during Lent | St. Matthias Church, 1685 Cordilleras Road, Redwood City

Stations of the Cross is a traditional devotion focusing on the events of the passion and suffering of Jesus, Our Savior. Stations of the Cross consists of 14 stations, highlighting the events of Jesus' last day as a human being. Stations of the Cross is a mini-pilgrimage. As the group moves from station to station, the scene is described. Followers hear about the event along the way of the cross, pray, sing and meditate. It is common practice to offer this devotion on the Fridays of Lent.

St. Matthias will offer the Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent at 6:00 pm followed by a simple soup supper. Each week, a different scriptural based text will be used. Leaders will provide booklets for participants to use as they pray the 14 stations.

All are welcome. We encourage parishioners to bring their own bowl and spoon. You may also choose to bring a vegetarian soup or bread and butter to share with the group. Drinks will be provided.

St. Francis Center in Redwood City has the opportunity to acquire three affordable housing properties totaling 47 units. Forty of the units are already affordable and operated by the Sisters of Charity in East Palo Alto who are selling them. St. Francis would like to buy them and maintain them as affordable homes. Seven units on two properties near the Center's services are also in negotiations. There are matching grants totaling \$2M for the properties making this a great opportunity for St. Francis Center to add to the affordable housing supply that they already maintain in our community.

A Story from Our Share the Warmth Drive

Each year, in October, St. Matthias parishioners are asked to “Share the Warmth” and donate coats, blankets and warm sweaters. These items are delivered to the Redwood City Homeless Help Center located at Fair Oaks Community Center. A volunteer recently shared this story with our St. Vincent de Paul Conference. It is a lovely testament to the big impact that a small action can have in someone’s life.

“I was working in the trailer at Redwood City’s Homeless Help Center when a man came and asked if we might have a blanket

because it had been SO cold! I had just found a strange unmarked bag which happened to have a large Mickey Mouse throw. I asked if he had to carry the blanket or not and he said he had an encampment so he didn’t have to carry it. I pulled out the bag and took out the throw—he was so thrilled. Under the throw there was a hand crocheted throw. The man saw it and his eyes grew big—“Wow!” he said. “You should take that too,” I said and he took a step back and started to refuse because it was too nice for him. “Go on, you deserve something nice too,” I said. The other volunteer encouraged him too and he took it, hugged it and got tears in his eyes. It must have brought back precious memories of someone or sometime in his life that really touched him. He took it and wrapped it up carefully in the bag and went off speechless.

I will never forget the look on his face. I felt for a flash that I was looking at the face of Jesus! It changed me forever! A flash of pure, generous, grace, I believe.”

Fasting and Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Roman Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Roman Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

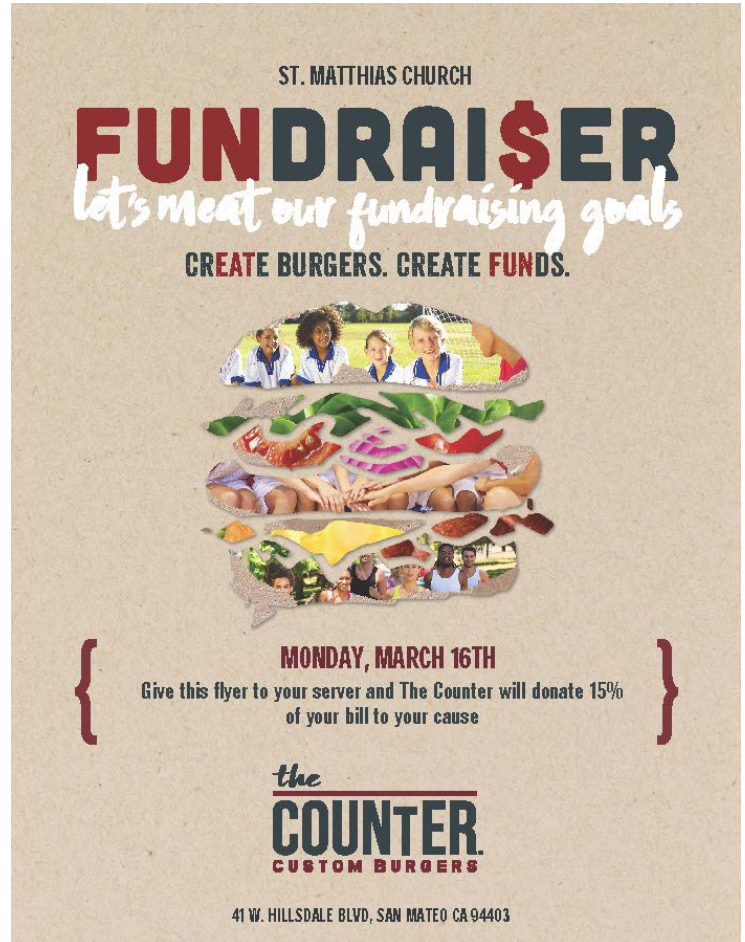
