Dear Parishioners,

One of my favorite Easter scenes took place at St. Vincent's School for Boys in San Rafael. As we celebrated the Easter vigil the evening before, (boys liked the fire), Easter morning was the time to clean the church of all the wax and abandoned programs. One particular Easter, one of the young wards took it upon himself to put on an altar server robe, go out and sit on the cement pillar, and call out to those who came from surrounding areas for mass: "The tomb is empty; He is not here!" It was not until one of the neighbors from across the highway came into the chapel laughing that I learned of this Easter angel. Robbie got the Easter message!

This Easter I am reminded of the empty tomb as our church buildings are empty of our people, the Body of Christ. We are not able to be together, and yet it is a powerful and poignant reminder that be it an empty cave or building, the Risen Christ is present in this world in each and every one of us. We are not discouraged for we learn from the example of those first witnesses to the empty tomb: the women who had come to serve the Lord in His death were now entrusted with the message of the Resurrection.

Yes, I will miss seeing so many wonderful members of our communities of St. Charles and St. Matthias gather this Easter Sunday. At the same time I know that the message of this Easter, as it was 2,000 years ago is the same: *He is Risen!* Let our response be the same as those first witnesses. They hurried to carry this Good News to others. May we do the same.
