Msgr. Gallagher resigned as pastor in May of 1983 due to poor health. The parish welcomed Fr. George Meyer as the fifth pastor in June of that year. Three years later, Fr. Meyer celebrated his 40th ordination anniversary in June. In September 1986, the parish celebrated it's twenty-fifth anniversary with a two day celebration.

Sr. Felicia, who had become Pastoral Associate, left St. Matthias after 14 years of service. Sr. Patricia Hunter was hired to follow in her footsteps. Sr. Ann Stubbe, SNDdN after serving as Director of the St. Matthias Day Care Center, moved to parish ministry work in San Jose. A teacher, Mrs. Gloria Riccardi became the new Director.



My friend and former colleague, Charlie
Huang, the father of three daughters ages 13,
11 and 5, has just suffered a reoccurrence of
leukemia and is in need of a bone marrow
transplant. Unfortunately, there is no match
for him in the registry. I'm making an appeal
to everyone I know (under the age of 60) to
get into the bone marrow registry to try to find
a match for Charlie.

It's simple to do:

- (1) Text AngelforCharlie to 61474;
- (2) A link will be texted back to you;
- (3) Go to the link and click "register online";
- (4) Fill out the fields;
- (5) The kit will be sent to the registrant's home within 3-5 business days;
- (6) Swab your cheeks;
- (7) Go back to the registration. Scan the barcode identifier (using your phone camera) so it can be linked to you. If if doesn't work, enter the barcode identifier into the phone;
- (8) 30 minutes after completion of registration, you will get a text message to confirm. Please reply "Yes".
- (9) Send the kit back.

Please share this request with family, friends and communities. Even if you're not a match for Charlie, you may be a match for someone else in need. Thank you and please join me in praying for Charlie.


