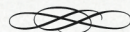

St. Matthias Preschool is seeking a preschool teacher for a full-time position who can passionately support children's early education.

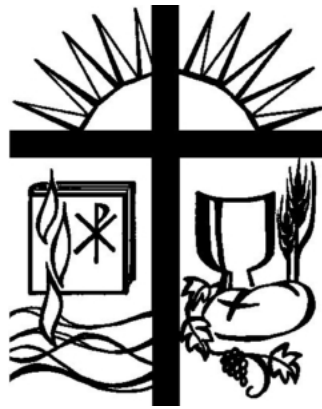
