Becoming A Fully Initiated Catholic - RCIA

Do you know someone who has thought about becoming Catholic or, for whatever reason, has been baptized but has not been confirmed or received Holy Communion? What does it mean to become fully initiated into the Roman Catholic Church? Do you or someone you know have questions about the sacraments and what it means to be a Catholic? Please consider RCIA.

The Catholic Church has a process for adults to discern whether God is inviting them to learn more about our faith and, perhaps, to become Catholic. This process is also a pathway to complete the Sacraments of Initiation for those already Baptized (Confirmation, Eucharist). This process is called RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). The RCIA process provides guided weekly sessions on the fundamental beliefs of our faith including an understanding of the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist (Mass). In addition, the process emphasizes prayer, discernment and spiritual formation as each candidate responds to their call to become followers of Jesus through the Catholic Church.

Participants include candidates from St. Matthias and St. Charles parishes along with their sponsors and team members. RCIA sessions will be held on Sunday mornings from 11 a.m. to noon. At this time, we are planning on hosting sessions in the St. Matthias Merry Room (off Fr. Lacey Hall). The first RCIA gathering will be held on Sunday, September 26th. Parishioners, who would like to participate as an RCIA team member and support our candidates, are welcome. Deacon Rich and Deacon David will lead and facilitate RCIA sessions. Bible Study: Old Testament Prophets

Deacon Rich will continue Bible Study on The Prophets of the Old Testament which began in April. Part 2 will begin on Monday, September 13th and be presented on-line via Google Meet. Participants can choose to attend sessions at either 10 -11:30 a.m. or 7 -8:30 p.m. You need not have participated in the previous series to join our fall series. The first several weeks will focus on the prophet Jeremiah, one of the major prophets of the Old Testament.

In the Letter to the Hebrews (1:1-2), the author writes, "In many and various ways God spoke of old to our fathers by the prophets; but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son. . ." Who were the prophets? What was their role in their own day? How should we read and understand their prophetic message? It is nearly impossible to understand the work and message of Jesus without an understanding of the prophetic books of the Bible. In this series, while we cannot study every prophet in depth, we will focus on the major prophets and a few minor prophets in the historical and theological context that prompted their messages.

All are welcome. No prior experience with Bible study is needed. Please bring your own Bible, notepad and pen to each session. Handouts and slides will be shared. While any Catholic Bible will suffice, the preferred Bibles are the New Revised Standard Version and The New American Bible. Please join us for any or all sessions. Council, Controversy, Conversion, and Communion Six-Week Course on the Second Vatican Council by Mark Brumley Offered online via Zoom on Tuesday nights at 7PM (PST) on October 5, 12, 19, 26 and November 2, and 9

The Second Vatican Council remains controversial in some Catholic circles. Many people see it as involving a radical break from the Catholic past, for good or bad. Others, such as the popes since the Council, see it as a renewal and reform of the one-and-the same Catholic Church.

This is mini-course covering the main teachings of the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). It also examines how the

Council's teaching has been received, misperceived, and resisted, as well as how it has shaped Catholic life and mission in the last half-century.
