

Course on the Eucharist

Beginning new year, the online School of Pastoral Ministry will be hosting a course on the Eucharist. The Eucharist is, like so many aspects of our faith, a great mystery. But to call something a mystery in the



theological sense is not to say that we cannot understand anything about it. Instead, it is to say that we can never learn everything about it. A theological mystery is not unintelligible; it is infinitely intelligible. In other words, even though we can never fully comprehend it, can never just put it in a box and move on, we can always learn more about a theological mystery. In our course together we will look at the multifaceted mystery of the Eucharist through several lenses.
