

What is The Matthian?



I won't be discriminated against, ignored, harassed, abused etc. simply because on the color of my skin. I don't worry every day for the safety of my children or grandchildren (no matter how old they are) because of their skin color. Learning about and understanding white privilege has been transformational.
