

Ash Wednesday: The Beginning of Lent

Lent is a time for penance and prayer. Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (March 2nd)



until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (April 14th).

Lent is a 40 day season leading up to Easter. The number forty calls to mind the 40 years that Moses and the Israelites wandered in the wilderness, and the 40 days that Jesus fasted in the desert.

St. Matthias will have two Masses on Ash Wednesday at 12 noon and 7:00 pm (see the calendar for additional Mass times at St. Charles). During the Mass, ashes will be blessed and distributed through the tracing of the Sign of the Cross on the forehead while the minister says, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

Ashes are a sacramental symbol of penance in the spirit of humility and sacrifice. This ritual is a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with a repentant heart.

During this season, the sacrament of Reconciliation will be available on Wednesday evenings beginning March 9th from 6:30 - 7:30 pm and as usual, on Saturday afternoons at 3:30 pm at St. Charles.

During this Lenten season, Catholics are asked to reflect on our lives, offer prayers for yourself and others, give to those in need and seek God's forgiveness.

Rite of Election (RCIA)

The Rite of Election is an important part of the process of preparing adults for the reception of the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. On the First Sunday of Lent, RCIA candidates, their families and team members gather



at cathedrals around the world to celebrate this rite.

Due to the pandemic, the Rite of Election of candidates from St. Matthias and St. Charles parishes will be held at St. Matthias during the 9:45 am Mass on Sunday, March 6th. The communities of both parishes are invited to participate in this Mass. If you are unable to attend, please keep our catechumens and candidates and their sponsors in your prayers.

The purpose of the Rite of Election is described in the introduction to the rite:

Thus the Church makes its "election," that is, the choice and admission of those catechumens who have the dispositions that make them fit to take part, at the next major celebration, in the sacraments of initiation.

This choice is made by the Church as an outward expression of the choice already made by God. God, through the Church, is choosing those who listen to God's call and choose to undertake a spiritual journey to be disciples of Jesus.
