Third Sunday of Advent - December 11, 2022

Reading 1 Is 35:1-6a, 10

The desert and the parched land will exult; the steppe will rejoice and bloom. They will bloom with abundant flowers, and rejoice with joyful song. The glory of Lebanon will be given to them, the splendor of Carmel and Sharon; they will see the glory of the LORD, the splendor of our God. Strengthen the hands that are feeble, make firm the knees that are weak. say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God, he comes with vindication; with divine recompense he comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared; then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the mute will sing. Rite of Welcome and Acceptance

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is a process in the Church which guides and supports those who feel a calling to become fully initiated members of the Roman Catholic Church. For the past three months, our candidates along with our St. Matthias/St. Charles RCIA Team Members have met weekly to learn about our faith and to depend each one's spiritual journey. This process with culminate with the reception of the sacraments at the Easter Vigil.

The first step in this process is a public acceptance of God's invitation and the parish community welcoming the candidates. The community is asked to pray for our candidates as they continue in the process of spiritual growth.

Simbang Gabi Advent Novena 2022

What is Sambaing Gabi? Sambaing Gabi (translation Masses at Night) is a long treasured Filipino spiritual tradition. In the Philippines, it was celebrated as a series of nine dawn Mases right before Christmas, each Mass followed by a reception for fellowship. For pastoral reasons, these daily novena Masses are now also celebrated in the evening. Set within Advent, Sambaing Gabi invites participants to heighten their preparation for the birth of Jesus, as well as honor the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The most popular symbol for Sambaing Gabi is the parol or star lantern which represents the star of Bethlehem. A parol is usually brought up during the processional to remind us of the guiding light that led many to the manger. All parishes are invited to process in with a parol at our Simbang Gabi Masses.

Simbang Gabi Masses will be held in our Southern San Mateo Country Deanery (comprised of 9 parishes in San Carlos, Redwood City, East Palo Alto, and Menlo Park) is being hosted in several locations this year as listed below.
