Second Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 15, 2023

Reading 1 ls 49:3, 5-6

The LORD said to me: You are my servant, Israel, through whom I show my glory. Now the LORD has spoken who formed me as his servant from the womb, that Jacob may be brought back to him and Israel gathered to him; and I am made glorious in the sight of the LORD, and my God is now my strength! It is too little, the LORD says, for you to be my servant, to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and restore the survivors of Israel; I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.

John testified further, saying,

"I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.'

Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God."

2023 Marks the 40th Anniversary of MLK Day

This year marks the 40th anniversary of the establishment of the Martin Luther King, Jr., holiday, the holiday we celebrate tomorrow. As a nation, we pay tribute to the values enshrined in Dr. King's message of love and hope in his efforts to engage us in bringing about true racial justice in our country. But our times would suggest that for all too many, that vision is becoming a vanishing reality. Five years ago, on the 50th anniversary of Dr. King's assassination, Archbishop Cordileone wrote, "too much of our reality is not so different from that of 1968." Indeed, look no further than current attempts in several states to silence even discussing our nation's history of racial injustice against people of color and its continuing impact on our society, under the pretext that it may cause "discomfort," a sentiment shared by many white Americans including many white Catholics. But as a people of faith, we must remember that Christ didn't come to make us feel comfortable but rather calls us out of our comfort zones in order to bring comfort to the oppressed, the alienated, the marginalized—to accompany and stand with those in their pain. It has been our mission from the earliest days of the church, a mission too often ignored throughout history. In what is considered among his most important works, Dr. King

wrote in his famous 1963 essay, "Letter from Birmingham City Jail," "If the church of today does not recapture the sacrificial spirit of the early church, it will lose its authentic ring, forfeit the loyalty of millions, and be dismissed as an irrelevant social club with no meaning." It is this sacrificial spirit, the Spirit of Christ, the spirit of self-giving all-embracing love, that we must ever re-kindle in our hearts. In his essay, Dr. King would also write, "We are caught in an inescapable network of mutuality, tied in a single garment of destiny." That destiny comes to its fulfillment through the love of God which unites all of us as one in belonging and is never silent to another's pain. On this Martin Luther King Day, may we as a community of faith, reaffirm our commitment, in a spirit of unity and hope, to bring God's love and true racial justice to all. - Deacon David

A New Year Wish List

Did you know that at St. Matthias Church and Preschool we have some expensive technical equipment that we hope NEVER to use? Our community is fortunate to have two Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) on-site, one in Fr. Lacey Hall and the other at St. Matthias Preschool. AEDs are life-saving devices that, along with CPR, greatly increase the chance of survival in the case of a sudden cardiac arrest. Prior to the pandemic, we hosted free training for anyone interested in learning how to use an AED. They are designed to be simple to use. Our AEDs are now over eight years old, beyond their warranty period at at the point where replacement battery packs and pads are becoming difficult to obtain. New AED devices will cost around \$2,000 each. Rather than continue to invest in our older units, we feel now is the time to replace them. This expense was unexpected and not budgeted. Please consider a donation to help us replace these units for 2023!
