

Lent is a time for self-reflection and prayer. In 2023, Lent runs from Ash Wednesday (February 22nd) until the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (April 6th).

Lent is a 40-day season leading to Easter. The number 40 calls to mind the 40 years that Moses and the Israelites wandered in the wilderness, and the 40 days that Jesus fasted in the desert.

The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday - February 22nd. St. Matthias will celebrate two Masses with the distribution of ashes; at 12PM and 7PM. St. Charles will have three Masses; at 8:30AM, 10:30AM (school Mass) and 5:00PM. During the Mass, ashes will be blessed and distributed through the tracing of the Sign of the Cross on the forehead while the minister says, "Repent, and believe in the Gospel."

Ashes are a sacramental symbol of penance in the spirit of humility and sacrifice. This ritual is a reminder that God is gracious and merciful to those who call on Him with a repentant heart. During this season, the **Sacrament of Reconciliation** will be available on Wednesday evenings beginning on March 1st from 6:30PM-7:30PM at St. Charles. Reconciliation will also be available as usual on Saturday afternoons at 3:30PM at St. Charles.

During this Lenten season, Catholics are asked to reflect on our lives, offer prayers for

ourself and others, give to those in need and seek God's forgiveness.

We will also be offering two Lenten retreats.

RCIA: St. Matthias & St. Charles

On the First Sunday of Lent, February 26th, at the 9:45AM Mass at St. Matthias, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending. There will be a brief introduction of the catechumen/ candidates and their sponsors. They will receive a blessing. All those present will be asked to pray for them.

That same day, all RCIA teams throughout the Archdiocese will convene at St. Mary's Cathedral at 4PM for the Rite of Election. These rites of "sending" and "election" reflect the early days of the Church when local Church communities prepared, supported, and celebrated initiating new members into God's Church.

Stations of the Cross

Stations of the Cross is a traditional devotion focusing on the events of the passion and suffering of Jesus, Our Savior. Stations of the Cross consists of 14 stations, highlighting the events of Jesus's last day as a human being.

Stations of the Cross is a mini-pilgrimage. As the group or individual moves from station to station, the scene is described. Followers here about the event along the way of the cross, pray, sing, and meditate. It is a common practice to offer this devotion on the Fridays of Lent.

St. Matthias has installed Stations of the Cross on the exterior of the Church building. We invite you to walk and pray at the stations at a time most convenient for you.
