

Reading 1 Ex 19:2-6a

In those days, the Israelites came to the desert of Sinai and pitched camp.

While Israel was encamped here in front of the mountain, Moses went up the mountain to God.

Then the LORD called to him and said, "Thus shall you say to the house of Jacob; tell the Israelites: You have seen for yourselves how I treated the Egyptians and how I bore you up on eagle wings and brought you here to myself.

Therefore, if you hearken to my voice and keep my covenant, you shall be my special possession, dearer to me than all other people, though all the earth is mine. You shall be to me a kingdom of priests, a holy nation."

Reading 2 Romans 5:6-11

Brothers and sisters:

Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die.

But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us.

How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath.

Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by his life.

Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

Gospel <u>Matthew 9:36—10:8</u>

At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them

because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd.

Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest."

Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness.

The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him.

Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town.

Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.'

Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

The Association of Pauline Cooperators (APC) is an important part of the Pauline Family founded in 1917 and brought into existence by Father James Alberione following an intense time of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament while he was a seminarian in 1900. Blessed James felt the need to have the laity share the Pauline spirituality and become actively involved in apostolic works by announcing the Good News and touching the lives of people of all times through various forms of media, prayer, and vocational apostolate.

Daughters of St. Paul in their various locations
in the United States and English-speaking
Canada in the Pauline mission of
evangelization with the means of social
communication. The Daughters of St. Paul

Mission Appeal for Kabale Diocese, Uganda (June 24-25th)

Kabale Diocese is one of the 19 dioceses in Uganda located in the southwestern corner of the country — about 280 miles from the capital city of Kampala. We serve a population of about 1.8 million people, and 800,000 are Roman Catholic. The vast majority of the people we serve are located in rural underserved, and mostly remote areas of the country. Most critical among the challenges faced is healthcare. The leading causes of death in Uganda include neonatal disorders, HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, malaria, lower respiratory infections, diarrheal diseases, congenital defeats, heart disease, stroke, road injury, and malnutrition.

The purpose of the appeal is to seek financial support toward the development of a hospital for the rural poor — Our Lady of Good Health Hospital Rushoroza. Through the gracious generosity of many, we have managed to complete the initial phase - outpatient department, minor operating room, medical surgical ward, and small delivery/maternity unit. We are transitioning into the next phase for which we are seeking assistance, a phase that comprises of a children's ward, dental, ophthalmology, radiology, medical laboratory units, and expansion on the emergency room, operating room, maternity unit, and ambulance services. Our one and only ambulance is 16 years old and almost beyond repair.

We are also seeking assistance to support our long-term Kabale Diocese Orphaned and Vulnerable Children Program. Through our foster home care program, we provide outreach support to orphaned children, the vast majority of whom have lost both parents and are left all alone to fend for themselves. We provide them with shelter, school tuition, clothing, and healthcare. We are currently supporting 540 children out of well over 20,000 greatly in need to help.

Additionally, although we are eternally grateful for the gift of vocations, currently 78 major seminarians and 820 catechist, we face a mounting challenge of their training and formation costs - \$400 per year for one seminarian, and \$150 per year for one catechist in training.

Any measure of outreach help will be greatly appreciated.
