## **Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**

Today's first two readings include dozens of phrases and aphorisms which could be framed and hung in a home, constant reminders of how to live as a family: "He stores up riches who reveres his mother." "Over all these put on love." "Be thankful." As we listen to God's word, may we appreciate these words of wisdom and hear how Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, despite the misunderstandings in today's Gospel story, have taken them to heart.

### **First Reading Sir 3:2-6, 12-14**

For the Lord honored the father above the children, and he confirmed the right of the mother over her sons.

Whoever honors his father atones for sins, and whoever glorifies his mother is like one who lays up treasure.

Whoever honors his father will be gladdened by his own children, and when he prays he will be heard.

Whoever glorifies his father will have long life, and whoever obeys the Lord will refresh his mother;

O son, help your father in his old age, and do not grieve him as long as he lives; even if he is lacking in understanding, show forbearance; in all your strength do not despise him. For kindness to a father will not be forgotten, and against your sins it will be credited to you.

### **Second Reading Col 3: 12-17**

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassion, kindness, lowliness, meekness, and patience, forbearing one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive.

And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, as you teach and admonish one another in all wisdom, and as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And

whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

### **Gospel Lk 2: 41-52**

Now his parents went to Jerusalem every year at the feast of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up according to custom; and when the feast was ended, as they were returning, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem.

His parents did not know it, but supposing him to be in the company they went a day's journey, and they sought him among their kinsfolk and acquaintances; and when they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem, seeking him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions; and all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers.

And when they saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you treated us so? Behold, your father and I have been looking for you anxiously." And he said to them, "How is it that you sought me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" And they did not understand the saying which he spoke to them. And he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man.

## Pastor's Message this January—Why Do We Go to Church?

As we begin this new year, I invite you to reflect on why we come to church. For each of us, there are various reasons. Some of us are assigned roles as lectors, ushers, or servers. Others may come to accompany family members or see friends.

Yet, I want to focus on the deeper, spiritual reason we gather together as the Body of Christ. In the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, we hear a powerful invitation: *"Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways, and that we may walk in his paths. For out of Zion shall go forth instruction, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem."* (**Isaiah 2:3b**)

The Church is the house of God here and now—a place where God encounters His people and we, His people, encounter God. It is in this sacred space that we are invited to draw near to the Lord, to listen to His word, and to be transformed by His presence.

Through the proclamation of the Word of God in the Scriptures, we learn of His ways and are called to walk in His paths. The Mass is not merely a ritual but a profound encounter with God. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: *"The Church is the place where God's word is proclaimed and His mysteries celebrated. Through the liturgy, we are made participants in the divine life and brought into communion with Christ."*

As we gather as a community, we experience not only the presence of God but also the presence of one another. We are reminded that we are part of the larger body of Christ, united in faith and love. Pope Francis has often spoken about the importance of coming together as a community: *"The joy of the Gospel is for all people: no one can be excluded."* (**Pope Francis, Evangelii Gaudium, 87**)

In these difficult times, especially as we continue to recover from the effects of the pandemic, I want to offer a special invitation to those who have been away from church. If you have not yet returned to the pews, I encourage you to join us in our Sunday liturgies and parish activities. There is no substitute for the grace we receive when we come together to worship.

In this parish, we gather not only to receive from God but also to offer ourselves in worship and service. As your pastor, I urge you to reconnect with your spiritual family. Come back to the house of the Lord, where we can encounter His love and be strengthened in our faith. Remember the words of Pope Benedict: *"The Eucharist is not just a symbol of unity but the true sacrament of the Church's unity."* (**Pope Benedict XVI, Sacramentum Caritatis, 52**)

Let us be encouraged by these words and rediscover the importance of our shared worship. As enter this new year, let us commit to making the Church a central part of our lives, not only out of duty but out of love for the One who calls us to Himself.
