Summer Ordinary Time: Growing in Faith Every Day

Living the Green Season of Discipleship

As the Easter season has come to a close, the Church enters Ordinary Time, a season often represented by the color green, symbolizing growth, hope, and new life. Although it may seem "ordinary" by name, there is nothing ordinary about this season. It is the longest season of the Church year and invites us to deepen our relationship with Christ through the ordinary moments of daily life.

During the summer months, our schedules often change. Vacations, family gatherings, camps, and travel can interrupt our normal routines. Yet our faith is not something we put on hold until autumn. God journeys with us wherever we go, calling us to encounter Christ in creation, in our families, in hospitality, and in moments of rest and recreation. Summer can become a sacred season of renewal if we intentionally make space for prayer and discipleship.

Keeping the Sabbath While Traveling

Whether staying close to home or traveling across the country, Catholics are called to continue participating in the Eucharist every Sunday. Before leaving for vacation, take a few moments to locate a nearby Catholic parish and include Mass as part of your travel itinerary. Visiting different churches can become a beautiful way to experience the universality of the Church and the many cultures that enrich Catholic worship.

Simple Summer Faith Practices

Here are several ways to continue growing in faith throughout the summer:

- Begin each day with a simple morning prayer, offering the day to God.
- Read the daily Gospel or Sunday readings before Mass.
- Pray grace before meals, especially when sharing meals with family and friends.
- Spend time outdoors appreciating God's creation and thanking God for its beauty.
- Pray the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet while traveling.
- Carry a small Bible or prayer book on vacation.
- Visit a local church for quiet prayer when exploring a new city.
- Practice generosity through acts of kindness, hospitality, or service to those in need.
- Keep a gratitude journal, noticing where God has been present throughout the day.

Creating a Domestic Church During Summer

Parents and grandparents can help children continue learning the faith by making simple traditions part of family life:

- Light a candle and pray together once a week.
- Read stories of the saints whose feast days occur during the summer.
- Discuss Sunday's Gospel during a family meal.
- Visit a shrine, monastery, or historic church as part of a family outing.
- Encourage children to notice God's presence in nature through hikes, beaches, mountains, or parks.

Faith formation does not stop when school ends; the home remains the first place where disciples are formed.

Growing Through Ordinary Time

The word "ordinary" comes from the Latin *ordinalis*, referring to numbered weeks rather than something commonplace. Ordinary Time teaches us that holiness is found in everyday life, such as in our work, our relationships, our rest, and our service.

Summer reminds us that growth often happens quietly. Just as gardens flourish through sunlight and care, our spiritual lives flourish through prayer, worship, Scripture, and acts of love. Every picnic, road trip, family reunion, and sunset can become an opportunity to recognize God's abundant grace.
